Vancouver Island Regional Science Fair: Helping students choose Science / Technology Careers

1977 - John Blenkinsopp - The science fair instilled a sense of inquiry in me that is still alive today. I started out in pure research and then moved into applied practice in healthcare. Science fairs helped ingrain a spirit of continual learning.



1993 - Verity Hoskins-Lopez - I never considered that science was something I was particularly good at. However, finding success at the science fair made me re-think some of the limits I had placed upon myself and my abilities. The fact that I had managed to produce something that elicited the approval of actual scientists was a newsflash to me: I could do anything I put my mind to.

1994/1996 Harmeet Chhina - I currently work as a Senior Research Scientist at Automotive Fuel Cell Co-operation (a joint research company between Daimler, Ford and Ballard). I often talk about my science fair experiences and how inspiring it was, not only to enter the fair but to actually win and get some great experiences.
