**Talk title: 'Varieties of (financial) capitalism  
in Europe and the financial crisis'**

Dr David Howarth is a Senior Lecturer at the University of Edinburgh and holds the Jean Monnet Chair. He joins UVic as a summer instructor, teaching a cross-listed course in Economics and Political Science that focuses on the global financial crisis. His research interests include: comparative political economy, French political economy, the political economy of Economic and Monetary Union (EMU), specifically the role of the European Central Bank in EMU, and the political economy of national financial systems. His recent publications include 'Die Krise but not La Crise? Financial crisis and the transformation of German and French banking systems', with Iain Hardie, *Journal of Common Market Studies*, 2009; 'Running an enlarged euro-zone – reforming the European Central Bank: Efficiency, legitimacy and national economic interest', in *Review of International Political Economy*, 14:5, December 2007, *The European Central Bank: The New European Leviathan?* with (Peter Loedel) (Palgrave 2005), second edition (first edn 2003); *The French Road to European Monetary Union* (Palgrave 2001) and *Contemporary France: Politics and Society* with Georgios Varouxakis (Edward Arnold 2003).
