Course Description and Requirements

Greek 102 continues Greek 101 as an introduction to Classical Greek. Formal learning of grammar and vocabulary is stressed, and supplemented with reading of passages in Classical Greek. We will begin with Athenaze book 1 Chapter 9, and will finish the end of Chapter 16 by the end of term.

In any introductory language course **regular attendance is essential**. There are three scheduled class meetings and one tutorial per week. Students should expect to spend roughly 1.5-3 hours in study for every hour of schedule class time. There will be a short quiz and a hand-in homework assignment each week, at the tutorial. Quizzes must be taken and homework handed in at the appropriate tutorial; no late submissions will be allowed. Further exercises and translations will be assigned as preparation for class and for the tutorial.

Assessment

The basis for determining grades will be as follows:

Weekly short quizzes (done in the tutorial)	7%
Weekly hand-in assignments (to be handed in at the tutorial)	8%
Preparation/ participation in class	15%
Four major quizzes @ 10% each (9/27, 10/18, 11/8, 11/29)	40%
Final examination	30%

All four major tests worth 10% each, and the final examination, must be completed to receive a passing grade in the course. You must receive an A+ on the final examination to receive an A+ on the

course. If your final examination earns a significantly **higher** grade than your term work, it may, at the discretion of the instructor, weigh somewhat more in the overall grade for the course. Students must perform all quizzes and assignments to receive a passing grade in the course. Breaches of academic integrity, as described in the U.Vic Policy on Academic Integrity, will be severely penalized¹.

Letter grades will be converted to GPA in accordance with the Grading table in the U.Vic Calendar². The grade will be calculated on the following scale:
