Course description: This course continues the introduction to ancient Greek presented in Greek 201, using the *Athenaze* texts (Books I and II). This course completes the survey of Greek grammar and syntax and will result in student reading continuous prose. As in the first semester, this course will meet 4 times per week, with a session for review with the TA (Trevor Van Damme) on Tuesday afternoons. Attendance and participation in all class meetings are ESSENTIAL. You may have 5 unexcused absences from the class or tutorial before each additional absence deducts 5% from your participation average.

Evaluation: The following table shows the equivalencies used when converting numerical scores to letter grades. Grade point values and a general description of each grade is given. These grades correspond to the grading schema in the University of Victoria calendar.
