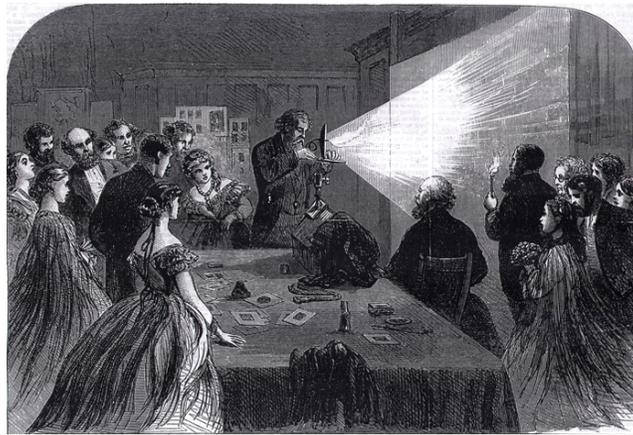

Workshops

Brian Maidment— Nineteenth-Century Prints:



This 3-hour workshop will use caricatures and other comic prints as a means of exploring techniques of making reproducible images. Prints both by well-known figures like Hogarth, Gillray, and Rowlandson and by relatively obscure jobbing artists and engravers will be considered. The teaching will be relatively informal and exploratory rather than narrowly didactic. No previous experience of working with prints is required, and participants will be encouraged to become engaged in discussion of images and their possible interpretations.

Jentery Sayers—Using *Omeka* to Exhibit Old Media (please bring a laptop):



How do we make a physical collection of old media (e.g., analogue photographs, videos, and audio) publicly available online for discovery, use, and interpretation? How do we translate such a collection into a rich, scholarly exhibit anchored in literary history and culture? And what are best practices for authoring, curating, updating, and preserving online exhibits? Directly addressing these questions, this three-hour workshop gives participants opportunities to test-run Omeka: a free and open-source platform designed specifically for building scholarly exhibits. During the workshop, participants will (in this order) survey existing Omeka exhibits, create a data model for an example exhibit, begin using the Omeka platform (via <http://www.omeka.net/>), learn the basics of Dublin Core metadata (for discovering media on the web), and discuss techniques for integrating the platform into existing research and teaching practices (with an emphasis on documenting and peer-reviewing digital scholarly communication). Technical competence required: know how to send an email.

Prior to the workshop, participants are encouraged to review the Omeka showcase of exhibits: <http://omeka.org/showcase/>. To the workshop, they should bring their own laptops and, if they so choose, some digitized content (e.g., images) they would like to exhibit.
