“Textual Performance” in Ulysses: Versioning Print Processes:

In this talk, Matt Huculak will present his new project (under development with the MVP) “Ulysses Versioned,” a collaboratively built series of TEI-encoded editions of Joyce’s novel ranging from its first publications in magazines to later pirated editions in the United States. Ulysses

continues to be performed as social text in pubs and classrooms, and Huculak will discuss the challenges of encoding such a popular work that has appeared in over 50 English-language editions alone. He also hopes to draw upon the collective wisdom of the UVic community as he undertakes this two-year project.

Matt Huculak received his PhD in English Language &



Literature at the University of Tulsa in 2009. He is a Postdoctoral Fellow and Co-Director of the Modernist Versions Project at the University of Victoria. He served as Project Manager for the Modernist Journals Project for four years, and a Postdoctoral Fellow with Editing Modernism in Canada. He is interested in developing tools for collaborative editing in online environments.
