



Stó:lō Ethnohistory Field School Consent Form

The Stó:lō Research and Resource Management Centre has invited students from the University of Saskatchewan and the University of Victoria to work on historical research projects that have been identified as important by staff. The projects examine aspects of Stó:lō history and/or aspects of Stó:lō-newcomer relations. All projects are meant to benefit the Stó:lō as new relationships are negotiated with other levels of the Canadian and British Columbia governments and as the Stó:lō assume fuller responsibility over the governance of their territories.

As part of our Field School research we would like to interview you about your memories of aspects of your culture and history. Your assistance is very valuable to us and we will respect your wishes regarding the interview. We understand that your participation in the interview and the length of time you choose to spend is entirely up to you. Please feel free not to answer any questions you do not wish to answer and end the interview at any time you wish. No explanation is necessary. You may withdraw from participating in the interview at any time, and at the end of the interview you will be asked again if you want to withdraw from participating.

One of the students in the field school would like to interview you and record the interview on an audio or video recorder. If you prefer not to be recorded, written notes will be taken instead. Originals of the tape recordings or interview notes will be placed in the Stó:lō Research and Resource Management Centre along with transcripts of the tapes if they are made. Copies of the recordings will also be stored in a locked cabinet in the History Department at the University of Saskatchewan. You will receive a copy of these recordings, and the students and their instructors will also keep copies to use in their research projects for the Stó:lō and for their degree/academic programs.

Once in the Stó:lō archives the original recordings and notes will be accessible for use by the Stó:lō and other researchers in accordance with the principles of the Stó:lō Heritage and Archives policies. Your contribution will be fully acknowledged on the archived records and in the finished project unless you request anonymity.
